ARRL Announces New Contests Web Portal

The ARRL Contest Branch has announced a new ARRL Contests Portal,

http://contests.arrl.org/

which ARRL Contest Branch Manager Bart Jahnke, W9JJ, calls "a one-stop shop for all of your ARRL contest interests, offering access to everything from the starting bell of a contest to your post-event hard-fought certificate of accomplishment."

Use the navigation tabs on the left to locate information about specific contests. Use the tabs at the top to submit logs, manage club eligibility lists, download certificates, and view other information for all contests. Jahnke said the new portal is still under construction, and information on specific contests and other contest-related content is being added every week.

ARRL Field Day 2018 Results

The ARRL 2018 Field Day results have been published on their webpage, and are printed in the December issue. 2018 was a poor year in terms of the sunspot cycle, and stations on the west coast are affected more than most other areas of the country due to geography.

10 and 15 meters did not open from the west coast to the east coast, and conditions on 20 meters were as struggle as most folks vacated 10 and 15 and moved to 20 meters resulting in huge crowds, coupled with poor propagation. 20 meters closed in the late afternoon, forcing our operations to 40 and 80 meters. Our 40m yagi did an outstanding job on phone.

Our 3-club effort at K7N resulted in a good score in comparison to other west coast and northwestern division outings. We had the top score for 3A in Oregon. We placed 3rd in Oregon amongst all categories, and 3rd in the Northwestern division for 3A.

The club is looking at future field day locations. While Scienceworks in Ashland is a wonderful location for public access, the location being in Ashland comes with significant paperwork and permit requirements. In 2019 we will be looking for locations that are easier to manage for the limited time of our volunteers.
