1. High Speed Multi Media MESH Networks for Ham Use

• **Program:** - High Speed Multi Media (HSMM) networking involves the use of the 2.4 GHz amateur band to provide not only point-to-point high speed data links, but also the ability to mesh multiple radios into a network that is resistant against failures. It achieves this by automatically building network routes that can bypass failed radios or RF path outages.

John will talk about inexpensive radios and antennas, along with free software that you can use to build your own network node, and to join the existing network in the Rogue Valley.

• **Biography:** John Armstrong, KF7UMK is the club secretary for 201, and also a member and founder of the Rogue Hack Lab. He is involved in computer and networking related projects.
