2020-01-07 RVARC Board Meeting Minutes

Discussion about the apparent non-receipt of the 2019 IRS Form 990-N, that treasurer Mike had hand-delivered to the Medford IRS office.

It was also mentioned that there seems to be a gap in receipt of some prior year's Form 990-N's. The board will need to investigate. Pat remarked that there appears to be a difference in our non-profit corporation type between the state and federal governments. The federal type is public benefit, consistent with our federal 501(c)3 status required by our Sept. 2000 governing Document, but the

Scott mentioned that there is a world-wide DX contest in March, and he plans to be working it from the Philippines.

There is a general plea for more participation in Governance and Presentations. All are encouraged to run for office, or give talks about their activities and interests.

8pm Presentation: Using the GQRX Linux SDR display program on the Raspberry Pi 4.

John, KF7UMK, showed that it was possible to install and run the SDR software GQRX on a Raspberry Pi 4 computer. The Linux operating system on the rpi was the 2019-07-10 version of raspbian-buster, which was the most recent at the time. Once the rpi was configured for locale, timezone, etc and to boot to the desktop, installation of the SDR software and all dependencies was as simple as running one install command from a terminal window:

```
sudo apt -get install gqr x- sdr
```

Installation took up about 600Mb more space on the uSDcard, and included gnuradio libraries and various sdr hardware drivers.

Then to get an optimized data-processing configuration, run `vol k_profile` from the terminal window.

Now GQRX can be found as a sub-item in the 'Internet' item-list of the main menu. It was tested with a cheap DVB-TV dongle from NooElect, and with a 2048kHz sample rate, the rpi cpu usage was around 75% on all 4 cores, with a memory usage of under 500Mbytes. The cpu temperature remained under 50C with a passive heatsink attached. The setup did not crash or complain during the demonstration.

But, there certainly could be issues with the particular SDR hardware you are using, for instance, the NooElect rtl2832U usb device needed to have a config file named rtl2832u.rules copied to the /etc/udev/rules.d folder so that type of USB dongle would be automatically recognized.

Overall, the system could be claimed to be workable. Perhaps we can try various other SDR hardware with this GQRX software, and share the results.

PS:

GQRX author Alexandru Csete has mentioned that he is writing a replacement for GQRX, so we may look to that for future progress. No date for release though. Any current serious issues with GQRX will likely not be fixed.
